# 2013 FINANCIAL REPORT

CURRENT STATUS AND TRENDS

medico international's total budget for the period under review was €18,539,496.53. While slightly lower than the previous year, it is still very high. This is due not least to the project reserves formed in 2012, which could not be spent until 2013.

#### INCOME

Donations received by medico in 2013 totalled €4,670,484.49. These include €784,872.98 in donations forwarded by ,Bündnis Entwicklung Hilft' (BEH). Without the BEH donations, income from donations amounted to €3,885,611.51, an increase on 2012, and continuing the rising trend of the past ten years. Public grants fell slightly to €5,374,379.16 in 2013 from €5,617,735.20 in 2012. Contributions from the medico international foundation totalled €120,000, an increase of 50% on 2012. This is due to a special donation to the foundation. The increase in donor membership is gratifying, with further growth of 289; this takes the number of permanent supporters to 2,693 from 2,404.

#### EXPENDITURE

In 2013, medico again received the Seal of Approval of the German Central Institute for Social Issues (DZI). The income statement on the following pages is based on the DZI's expenditure categories, which distinguish between operational expenditure and expenditure on advertising and administration. Operational expenditure includes project funding, project management and campaigning and awareness-raising work. In 2013, operational expenditure totalled €11,294,264.53, or 92.18 % of total expenditure. This breaks down into €9,413,053.93 (76.83 %) spent on project funding, €1,013,683.61 (8.27 %) on project management and €867,526.99 [7.08 %] on campaigning and awareness-raising work. medico's project expense rose again in the period under review by 3.4 %, specifically because it was possible to implement projects which had been initiated as long-term ventures. The necessary funds came from the reserves formed in earlier years.

In all, we funded a total of 93 projects in 2013, including large programmes such as humanitarian mine clearance in Afghanistan, emergency aid to the Philippines after the devastating typhoon, work in Palestine/Israel and aid for Sahrawi refugees in West Sahara. Major challenges included the support programmes in Syria and Sri Lanka. In Bangladesh and Pakistan we assisted partners caring for the victims of the collapsed textile factories, and in Latin America we promoted psychosocial projects for survivors and relatives of victims of the military dictatorships. In Mexico, Mali, Mauritania and Sierra Leone we supported migrants on their exhausting and dangerous way to the North. With our ongoing support of the worldwide People's Health Movement we contributed again to the creation of an independent international public.

#### RISKS AND OPPORTUNITIES

The solid financial basis for medico's work was again confirmed in 2013. While the positive balance in 2013 required further recourse to the free reserves, the need was significantly smaller than anticipated at the start of the budget year. The positive trend in donations continued in 2013.

Use of the social media was considerably expanded in the period under review in order to interest younger people in medico's work. In future, however, it will be important to keep an eye on trends in this area posing a risk to democracy. Addressing the political dimension of health has proved a good decision, and discussion about health has become more political again, particularly in the course of the global debate about possible post-2015' development goals. medico has been committed for years to the view of health as part of a social infrastructure and a common good financed through redistribution, and this is now increasingly shaping health policy discussions.

The risks apparent in medico's work relate primarily to our partners in the South, who are facing growing financial problems from two directions: on the one hand, the growing social divide demands increased efforts, while on the other hand access to funds through official development cooperation is becoming increasingly restricted. A problem here is that recently there has been less and less attention paid in parliamentary circles to global issues, unless they had security policy and economic relevance.


#### CONCLUSION




### EVOLUTION OF INCOME [IN EURO M]
